**St. Paul's Episcopal Cathedral All-American Summer Blood Drive**  
**Tuesday, June 24, 2:00—6:00 PM**

We are now scheduling donors for Tuesday June 24, 2-6pm. Donors may call me at work: 636-4387; at home: 682-2871; on my cell phone: 258-1332; or email me: [henrycm@usa.redcross.org](mailto:henrycm@usa.redcross.org); or go direct to the website: [redcrossblood.org](http://redcrossblood.org) to schedule donation appointments.

- Blood donations often decline during the summer months when many donors are vacationing and busy with summer activities, and when high schools and colleges are generally out of session. Up to 20 percent of blood donations come from high school and college blood drives during the academic year. But the need for blood is constant. Eligible donors of all blood types are needed.
- Recently a hospital served by the Mid-America Blood Services Division performed two liver transplants. The patients required a total of 80 units of red blood cells, 16 units of platelets, 120 units of plasma and 5 units of cryoprecipitate. Thanks to our dedicated blood donors both patients are both doing well.
- Presenting donors (ages 21 and older) between May 16 and September 7, 2011 will be entered for a chance to win a trip for four to Orlando, Florida each time they visit the Red Cross to give blood or platelets.
- The Red Cross is proud to partner with 3M and Roush Fenway Racing for the fourth year in a row to bring the Red Cross Racing program to dedicated blood and platelet donors nationwide.
- After each donation, donors can log on to [redcrossracing.com](http://redcrossracing.com) to record their blood and platelet donations and get points that they can exchange for great prizes or donate to the Red Cross Services to the Armed Forces.

Once again we will be serving hot dogs, chips, veggies n dip, plus apple pie for dessert. We need some volunteers for setting up (12-1:30pm) and tearing down (6-7pm) in addition to greeters and canteen hosts.

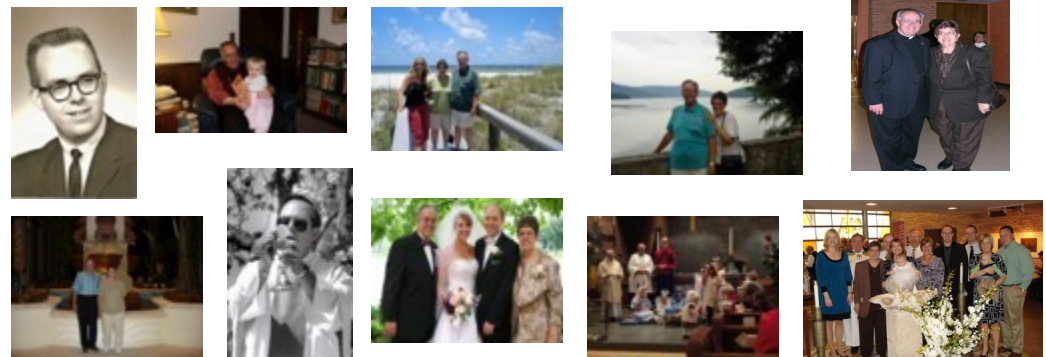

**Zambia Medical Mission — Expectant mother kits needed**

Ann Winget will be travelling to Zambia July 7-27 as part of a Medical Mission Trip.

The **Zambia Medical Mission** is an annual medical outreach conducted in the remote villages of southern Zambia. The Zambia Medical Mission is a non-profit organization based in Abilene, Texas. It is one of the largest recurring medical missions in the world.

Each July the medical mission team consisting of approximately 200 American and Zambian volunteers traverse rural Zambia providing medical care, food relief, AIDS education, and spiritual counseling to the Zambian people. In 2010, approximately 19,500 people received care.

About 60 million women in developing countries give birth with only the help of an untrained attendant or family member or with no help at all. Many of these deliveries take place at home and often in a small hut on a dirt floor in a remote village. The infection rate is high with some 1,600 women per day dying from complications associated with pregnancy and childbirth, and infection is the leading cause. Around 950,000 newborns per year die from infection. Many of these infections can be avoided when Clean Delivery Kits (CDK's) are used.

A \$10.00 donation pays for two kits for expectant mothers.

If you are interested in participating with a donation to provide Clean Delivery Kits, please make checks payable to Zambia Mission Fund and send it to Zambia Mission, 658 E.N. 21st St., Abilene, TX 79601, or leave a donation for Ann in the Cathedral Office. You may also mail your donation to Ann Winget, 135 W. Forest Hill, Peoria, IL 61604. Ann has offered a "Baby Magnet" to anyone who makes a donation. This is a magnet to use as you celebrate a birth among family and friends. These magnets are designed to be placed on cars and trucks to announce the joyous birth. All monies will be sent to the Zambia Medical Mission Fund and be used to purchase materials for the CDK's.

**PENTECOST MOBILE**

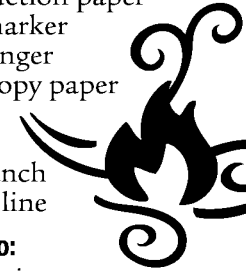
Make this craft as a reminder that God's Holy Spirit is all around you.

**What you need:**

- Tissue paper (red, yellow, orange), torn into squares
- Plastic transparency
- Craft glue
- Paintbrush
- Construction paper
- Black marker
- Wire hanger
- White copy paper
- Scissors
- Pencil
- Hole punch
- Fishing line

**What you do:**

1. Overlap tissue squares as "flames" on the transparency.
2. "Paint" glue (thinned with water) over the squares.
3. Fold construction paper in half. Write out Acts 2:4 at the top, by the fold.
4. Poke the hanger through the middle of the fold.
5. On the white paper, write "Holy Spirit" in English, Spanish (*Espiritu Santo*), French (*L'esprit Saint*), etc.
6. Cut out a flame pattern and trace it on the back of the transparency.
7. Cut out flames and glue the "Holy Spirit" names on them.
8. Thread fishing line through a hole atop each flame and tie flames onto the hanger.

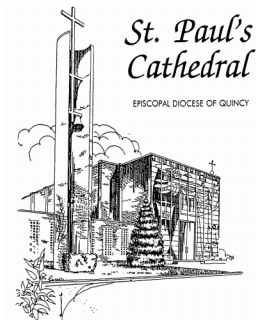
